„... I'm fine, working in a school in Gemona del Friuli, in a region at the North-East of Italy, close to the Austrian border. It's the first year as a school principal. At the moment all the schools are closed in Italy. Teachers, students and employees are enforced „smart Working“ from home. So I'm at home in Frosinone, keeping in touch with teachers via computer.

Public life in my country is possible only on TV and ICT tools. Today news is that the only shops open are groceries and pharmacies. In Northern Italy, there is a large area where the virus is widespread. It covers the whole Lombardia, part of Emilia, part of Veneto, part of Piemonte. In the rest of the country, the situation is still manageable enough.

As für Erasmus+, my new school has no experience in European projects. So I'm trying to involve teachers in some Erasmus+ projects. But now everything seems to be overwhelmed by this Coronavirus cyclon.
